Special opening hours may apply on holidays or on other occasions.

General

Children are very welcome. Before they have reached the age of ten, however, they can visit the museum only when accompanied by an adult.

Admission fees

Free admission

- Children under the age of 6 years
- Children and teenagers on presentation of a valid student ID-card daily after 3 p.m.

With appropriate validation from the institution or valid ID

- Students and teachers preparing a visit to the museum, Kulturprojekte and Jugend im Museum,
- A recognized accompanying person for a severely disabled person,
- Members of the FSDTB and the Association of the Cultural Society Free Balloon,
- Members of the press,
- Employees of museums, members of ICOM and DMB.

Special admission fees can be charged for special exhibitions or events.

The admission ticket is valid on the same day at the Deutsches Technikmuseum, Trebbiner Strasse and the exhibition area at Möckernstraße (Science Center Spectrum, „Man in motion“, Ladestraße). Please hold on to your ticket.

Cloakroom, Objects and Animals

- Backpacks and large bags can be left at the cloakroom or in the lockers. Classes must leave their backpacks at the cloakroom. Umbrellas must be left at the cloakroom.
- At the Science Center Spectrum for safety reasons all backpacks and large bags must be left at the cloakroom or in the lockers.
- Storage is free of charge.
- Plastic bags may be obtained at the cloakroom for objects needed inside the exhibitions.
- An amount of 3 € is charged for lost cloakroom tickets, and an amount of 20 € for lost keys.
- Sports equipment and larger toys as well as pieces of luggage and bulky objects are not allowed inside the exhibit areas.
- Animals are not permitted except dogs for severely disabled persons.

Conduct in the exhibit areas

- The instructions of the museum staff have to be observed.
- Eating, drinking, smoking and the use of mobile phones are prohibited inside the exhibit areas except for marked areas.
- Touching and mounting exhibits is not permitted. Exceptions are marked.
- It is forbidden to enter areas that are sealed off.
- The visitors' attendants have the right to expel visitors from the museum when they grossly violate the Rules for Visitors or when they represent a danger to safety and order in the museum or to the safety of other visitors.
- Staircases, passageways and escape routes must be kept clear for security reasons.
- Visitors are liable for all damages caused by their conduct.
- Parents, teachers and other persons with parental authority are obliged to observe their supervising duty during the entire visit. They are liable for the persons in their charge.
- For security reasons only the laid-out paths must be used in the open-air grounds. Rail tracks and vehicles in the open-air grounds are off limits.

Taking Photographs and Videotaping

Taking photographs and videotaping for private purposes (without tripod etc.) are permitted. Taking photographs and videotaping for commercial purposes require prior written permission and voucher, and are subject to a fee.

Guided Tours

Expert guided tours of the museum are given exclusively by members of the museum's own guide team. They are subject to a fee and require prior registration.

Liability

The museum does not assume liability for damages to visitors resulting from the museum's installments and exhibits except in cases of intentional or gross negligence on the part of the museum.

Visitors' Book

With regard to the admission price and the fees for guided tours, the museum reserves the right to special arrangements for certain, limited groups.
